GRID SQUARE MANIA

It appears that grid square mania has struck one of our club members. With the help of an aurora opening on the VHF bands during the weekend of the January VHF contest, Rick WB2QOQ is another step closer to achieving the 2-meter Century Club Award. This award; the VHF cousin of the DXCC (DX Century Club) on the low bands; is called the VUCC, Vhf/Uhf Century Club. It may be obtained by confirming contact with stations in 100 of the 2 degree by 1 degree grid squares above 50 MHz. This ARRL sponsored achievement award began in 1983 to help boost activity on the higher frequencies. Rick started working toward the award on 2 meters in 1984. He enjoys VHF contesting, and has participated in just about every ARRL VHF contest since 1979, the year after he moved to New Providence. During the contests, there is a better chance of working new grid squares, with many more people being on the air. The aurora opening during the latest contest added 7 new grid squares to Rick's total count. He now has 100 grids worked on two meters, but they are not all confirmed. As we go to press, he has 85 grids confirmed with QSLs, and is eagerly waiting for more cards to come in. Even when you send an SASE with your QSL, you do not always get a response. We will keep you posted on the latest happenings regarding Rick's status in obtaining the 2 meter VUCC Award. Anyone who would like to chtain more information on grid squares, please see Rick, WB2QOQ.


