
SPARK GAPS STAFF GROWING!

AT&T PREPARES FOR ONSLAUGHT OF SUN SPOT ACTIVITY

(news release of 12/15/89) NEW YORK -- Don't be surprised if your phone calls end in a lot of busy signals this February.

That's when an 11-year cycle of solar-flare activity is expected to peak, potentially disrupting long-distance communications traffic and even electrical power.

American Telephone & Telegraph Co. says it has done all it can to prevent problems. But it makes no guarantees.

The culprit is extraordinary bursts of electromagnetic energy from explosions on the sun's surface, a phenomenon that scientists call the "solar maximum."

"This excess current will sometimes seek out the best conductor, such as a long-haul communications cable or even the Alaskan oil pipeline," says Louis J. Lanzerotti, a senior scientist at AT&T's Bell Laboratories.

Then, suddenly, long-distance phone traffic is disrupted and ham radios get staticky. Even some communications satellites 23,000 miles above Earth become disoriented, and their signals miss their Earth stations.

AT&T's communications network has been stunned by solar activity on numerous occasions this century, leading to some technological advances.

In August 1972, for example, a huge electrical surge from a solar flare knocked out power on a long-distance cable between Chicago and Iowa,

disrupting service for an hour. The accident lost "a lot of revenue" and led Bell Labs to redesign AT&T's power supplies "at a nontrivial cost." But the new equipment makes it unlikely that a similar accident could happen today, says Mr. Lanzerotti, fingers crossed.

Today, "scientists can't predict accurately the magnitudes of the currents that might come because there are no scientific models that will translate the path of a solar flare and its effect on the Earth," Mr. Lanzerotti says.

The impact could be devastating. Last March, for instance, solar activity was blamed for an electrical surge that blew out some electrical transformers in Quebec, causing a nine-hour blackout.

"The same thing could happen again," he says.
