D-Star Presentation on January 14th

Our meeting on Monday night January 14th will feature a presentation by Randy Gutentag WA2RMZ about ICOM's D-Star systems. D-Star is a digital voice and data protocol that ICOM has incorporated in some of its VHF and UHF radios. Randy is a co-trustee and owner of the NJ2DG D-Star repeater system in Martinsville (441.650 mHz), one of the few in the state (http://www.nj2dg.org/).

The D-Star system has several fascinating aspects including crystal clear audio, simultaneous voice and text/data reception, and fast transfers of data files, such as images. Since the radios use the TCP/IP protocol, D-Star repeaters around the country can be linked via the internet. And when the radio is connected to a PC, e-mail and other Internet applications are available. So join us Monday for what promises to be a very interesting and informative demonstration of this emerging technology!

Crystal Radio Contest - January 18th through 28th (yes, ten days)

The main crystal set contest of the year put on by the Birmingham Alabama Crystal Radio Group is coming up in a couple of weeks. The objective is to receive as many AM broadcast band or short wave stations as possible with a receiver powered by only the incoming signal - no amplifiers allowed. There are actually a few different classes and one is aimed toward hams who make two-way QSOs in the ham bands using a crystal receiver. This is a great opportunity to throw together a simple crystal set or a highly optimized one and find out what you can receive. This main contest is put on at this time each year because the receiving conditions for broadcast band dx are best and the idea behind such a long contest is to create a low-pressure event with emphasis on building and experimenting, not marathon, beat-the-other-guy contesting.

Please consider trying this event. It might be more fun than you think and you'll probably learn a surprising amount. Several NPARC members are already planning on participating to some degree. Check out Birmingham ACRG website for all the details: www.crystalradio.us

The following information is provided by WB2QOQ, who has been recording daily weather events at his station for the past 25 years.

Minimum temperature for this December, 18 deg. F (December 6) Last December 16 deg. F.

Average Minimum temperature this December, 28.5 deg. F

Minimum diurnal temperature range, 3 deg. (34-37 deg.) 12/22 Maximum diurnal temperature range, 23 deg. (58-35 deg.) 12/23

Average temperature this December, 33.7 deg. F Average last December, 40.1 deg. F

Number of days this December with temperatures 32 deg. or above: 27

PRECIPITATION -

Total precipitation this December: 5.5" snow 4.92" rain/melted snow combination

Total precipitation last December: 2.27" rain

Maximum one day precip. event this December: .73" rain (23rd), 2" snow (13th & 16th)

Measurable rain fell on 10 days this December.

Voice of Russia on 7350 KHz

I'm not sure what their entire broadcast schedule is, but Voice of Russia transmits a strong AM signal in English just above our 40 meter ham band. Activities Chairperson: Vince Lobosco, KC2IZK Activities Vice-Chair: Andy Stillinger, WA2DKJ


