ELECTION TIME IS NEAR-

It's nearly that time of year when we have to think of election of officers to manage the affairs of the Club. NPARC's constitution calls for an election of officers at the annual meeting, which is held in November of each year. The elected officers are President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer and Activities Manager. Briefly, the functions of the several officers are:

President - Conducts the meetings and performs the usual presidential functions. Vice President - Acts in the absence of the President plus special assignments and heads the Publicity and Membership Committees.

Secretary - Keeps the Club's records and handles correspondence. Treasurer - Keeps the Club's books, collects dues, pays bills.

Activities Manager - Supervises the Club's station activities, organizes Club contests, directs the meeting programs and the licensing course.

These officers form the Executive Committee which meets at least once each quarter to plan the Club programs and activities.

The main requirement for an officer to be effective is to be enthusiastic and have a little time he can devote to the job. The pay is not too good, but the rewards are heaven-sent.

A nominating committee has been appointed including George (WN2WVB), chairman, and Dave (WA2FWL) and Bob (W2YMA), who will meet prior to the November meeting to prepare a slate of officers for nomination. The nomination committee is required to place at least one name in nomination for each position at the annual meeting. Other nominations will be welcomed from the floor. The election will follow.

A discussion of the officials of the club would not be complete without mention of those appointed by the president to fill standing committees. Charlie (W2RHI) has been custodian of the Club license and has provide liaison with the Recreation Commission. Charlie is moving out of New Providence, however, and Andy (WB2WGH) has "volunteered" to be custodian. Bob (W2YFM) is TVI Committee Chairman; Roland (WhURS/2) has been Field Day Manager, but is also moving away. In addition the posts of Publicity Chairman and Membership Chairman are open, which means there are some good jobs open for volunteers.

More active members make for a livelier and more interesting club. Are there any volunteers.

Because of the importance of this meeting we hope that everyone will attend and will take the opportunity to invite other Hams or interested people, whether or not a member of the Club, to attend.
