LINEAR AMPLIFIERS ON TAP FOR OCTOBER 11 MEETING

This month we positively mean what we say! Bob Latter (W2YFM) and David Latter (WB2FUE) will absolutely, without any reasonable shadow of doubt whatever, appear at the October 11 meeting to show and describe the design and construction of a grounded-grid linear amplifier. The design, originally from QST, uses parts almost entirely from the junk box and is thus an economical way to get extra punch into a C.W. or S.S.B. signal to cut through the QRM.

And the unit works, too! Dave gathered more than 141,000 points in the 1971 ARRL Int. DX contest using this amplifier. So home-brew is not dead - and the home-brew built gear does its job well. Come and learn how to do it.

The meeting will be held at Headquarters Building of the Red Cross in Summit at 8 p.m.

Two well known local hams, Bob (W2yfm) and David (WB2FUE) Latter, of Pittsford Way, New Providence, will describe the design and construction of a grounded-grid amplifier made almost entirely from junk-box parts.

In addition to being an interesting construction project, the amplifier represents an economical way for a ham to get extra "punch" into his signal to extend the range of his transmitter/
